

A Recipe from Tennie

Dutch Apple Pie

I share with you one of the essential flavours of my childhood, we had this most weekends and whenever we could think of an excuse. Apple pie is one of the greatest Dutch exports (together with beer, gin, cheese, footballers, tulips and Quy residents...).



Ingredients

For the crust

300 gram plain flour

180 gram butter

150 gram sugar

zest of 1 lemon

1 beaten egg

For the filling

1 kg tart apples, peeled and cut into chunks and covered in the juice of the lemon

50 gram sultanas or raisins

50 gram sugar

half to one teaspoon of cinnamon

Preheat the oven to 200°C. Rub the flour with the butter as if you're making a crumble. Add the zest and sugar and bind it with the egg. Form into a ball. Use three quarters to line a buttered (and if you wish, lined) spring form tin. Either by rolling the dough and lifting it into the tin or by pushing the dough into the tin.

Tip in the filling, with as little juice as possible. Roll out the rest of the dough and cut into strips to form a lattice over the top of the filling, making sure the apple filling still shows.

Bake for 45 minutes to an hour until golden.

Can be served cold with coffee or hot for dessert. The Dutch often serve it with whipped cream.

News from Darwin Nurseries

Harvest time keeps us very busy here at the nursery. At the moment we are using a lot of the produce we have grown to make jams and chutneys. We've got strawberry and blackcurrant jam, pickled beetroot and marrow chutney among others.

We also have lots of tomatoes which we have grown in our polytunnel. There are heritage, Italian, plum and cherry tomatoes which will all continue to grow well into the autumn. There's a good choice of our own produce in the shop including potatoes, onions, garlic, cucumbers, beans, courgettes, beetroot, chard and spinach. The squashes and gourds are coming on nicely in all their different, bright colours and it won't be long before the pumpkins begin to turn orange. Looking towards Halloween we are refurbishing a life-size wooden witch to put in the shop.


We have an apple project this autumn. Apart from making apple chutney, we will be pressing apples to make apple juice. Our co-workers will be researching traditional recipes and will be designing our own labels.

We are going to be adding to our chickens after a recent visit from a fox. The chickens that are still with us are excellent layers producing super large eggs some of which are double yolkers. We also have two new rabbits who seem to be inseparable friends.

We're planting a pansy mountain which promises to be very colourful, so we will also be planting out hanging baskets and tubs for the winter.

We've been ordering roses and fruit trees which are good for planting in the autumn. We are concentrating on scented roses especially David Austin. Some of the fruit trees will be heritage varieties from around this area. These include Cambridge and Willingham greengages, Chivers Delight, first grown in Histon in 1920 and Buerre Bedford plum which dates back to 1902.
